GAME DAY

Colgate (4-6, PL 3-2) closes out its season on Saturday, when the Raiders travel to Lewisburg, Penn. to face the Bucknell Bison (5-5, PL 2-3) at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m.

Colgate will be battling for a chance to finish in a three-way tie for second place in the Patriot League standings. A Colgate victory, coupled by a Lehigh win over Lafayette would give the Raiders a tie for second place.

Colgate is coming off a 29-28 win over Holy Cross, while Bucknell was idle last Saturday. They dropped a 27-10 decision to the Crusaders on Nov. 4.

THE SERIES

This is the 55th meeting between Colgate and Bucknell with the Raiders leading the series, 39-5. The Raiders have won five of the last six meetings in the series. Bucknell's lone win during this stretch was in the last meeting in Lewisburg, a 42-7 decision in 2004. Colgate is 16-7 all-time on Bucknell's home turf.

Last year, Colgate edged Bucknell 16-10 at Andy Kerr Stadium.

LAST MEETING

Trailing 10-3 after three quarters, Colgate quarterback **Mike Saraceno** led a fourth quarter rally that gave the Raiders a 16-10 win over the Bison at Andy Kerr Stadium.

Until the offense finally got untracked in the fourth quarter, the Raider defense played a solid game holding the Bison to 225 yards of total offense, and one field goal.

After Bucknell had taken a 10-3 lead with 2:03 remaining in the third quarter, Colgate came right back, marching 70 yards in nine plays to tie the game two minutes into the final quarter.

On fourth-and-two at the Bucknell 27, Saraceno rolled right and scampered down the sideline for his fifth rushing touchdown of the season.

Jacob Stein's extra point tied the contest with 13:03 remaining.

Colgate's defense forced the Bison to punt on the next series giving the Raiders excellent field position at the Colgate 45.

On the ensuing possession, Saraceno completed a key third-down pass to Kenny Parker for six yards, and later, connected with DeWayne Long on a 20-yard strike for a first down at the Bucknell 10.

Three plays later, Saraceno hooked up with Parker again for a seven-yard touchdown reception to give the Raiders a 16-10 lead with 7:13 remaining. The extra point was missed.

The Bison had two more possessions, but Colgate's defense held on both occasions with the final stop coming on fourth-and-11 at the Bucknell 45.

Colgate's **Jordan Scott** was the leading rusher in the contest carrying 30 times for 103 yards. Saraceno, who was playing with a separated shoulder suffered in the Lafayette game, completed 19-of-34 passes for 181 yards.

On the defensive side of the football, Colgate allowed 32 yards passing and 193 rushing. **Jared Nepa** had a game-high 11 tackles including two

TFL's, while **Andrew Moore** and **Josh Wurst** had eight tackles apiece. **Geoff Bean** had his eighth career interception, while Nepa, **David Wesley**, **Chris Petrone** and **Cody Williams** had fumble recoveries for the Raiders.

COLGATE VS. PATRIOT LEAGUE TEAMS

Over the last 11 seasons, the Raiders are 53-13 against Patriot League teams for a winning percentage of .803. They have lost to Lehigh six times, Bucknell three times, Holy Cross twice, and once each to Fordham and Lafayette.

COLGATE HEAD COACH

Colgate head coach **Dick Biddle** is in his 11th season with the Raiders. He has an overall record of 88-41 for a .682 winning percentage. He is the sixth winningest active Division I-AA coach. In 2003, he was named the American Football Coaches Association Division I-AA National Coach of the Year, and three times in his career he has been Patriot League Coach of the Year.

His winning percentage is the highest of any coach who has coached eight or more seasons in the Patriot League. He is the second winningest coach in school history.

Biddle is the first Colgate coach to post 10 straight winning seasons and the first Colgate coach to record nine straight seasons with seven or more victories.

COLGATE IN THE NATION STATS

Junior linebacker **Mike Gallihugh** (Midlothian, VA) is first in tackles with 12.60 per game; sophomore tailback **Jordan Scott** (Hyattsville, MD) is 22nd in I-AA with 105.0 yards per game and 24th in scoring with 7.60 points per game; senior punter **Jason Sutton** (North Easton, MA) is 26th in punting with 40.58 yards per punt; senior quarterback **Mike Saraceno** (Sunrise, FL) is 17th in total offense with 224.1 yards per game; and senior **Geoff Bean** (Oneonta, NY) is 11th in punt returns with 14.08 yards per return.

COLGATE IN PATRIOT LEAGUE STATS

Jordan Scott is first in rushing with 105.0 yards per game, second in scoring with 7.60 points per game and second in all-purpose running with 121.4 yards per game.

Mike Gallihugh (Midlothian, VA) is first in tackling with 12.60 per game.

Mike Saraceno (Sunrise, FL) is second in total offense (224.1 ypg).

Jason Sutton (North Easton, MA) is third in punting averaging 40.58 yards per attempt.

Geoff Bean (Oneonta, NY) is second in punt returns with 14.08 yards per return.

Erik Burke (Traverse City, MI) is third in receiving yards per game with 52.0.

Cody Williams (Blasdell, NY) is third in interceptions with .30 per game.

FIRST IN DEFENSE

Colgate's defense is **second** in the Patriot League in total defense, allowing 313.4 yards per outing - 144.3 rushing and 169.1 passing. The Raiders are first in pass defense (169.1).

Colgate is **second** in passing offense (200.0) and total offense (360.9).

They are **third** in rushing offense (160.9), scoring defense (21.2), passing efficiency defense (114.0), passing efficiency (132.88) and sacks (1.60).

TOUGH AGAINST THE RUSH

Over the last 11 seasons, the Raiders have held the opposition to less than 100 yards rushing 54 times, and are 51-3 when doing so. So far this season they have done it three times: vs. Dartmouth (54), Georgetown (75) and Fordham (85).

BREAKS TWO-YEAR RECORD

Jordan Scott has rushed for 2,414 yards in his first two seasons breaking Kenny Gamble's (1984-85) record for most career rushing yardage by a sophomore running back. Gamble had 1,993 yards.

BACK-TO-BACK 1,000-YARD SEASONS

Jordan Scott has become the third player in school history to post back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons. He joins former Colgate All-American and Walter Payton Award winners - Kenny Gamble (1985, 1986 and 1987) and Jamaal Branch (2003 and 2004).

SCOTT NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON WATCH LIST

Colgate sophomore tailback **Jordan Scott** is one of 16 players named to the "Payton Watch" list by The Sports Network.

The 20th Walter Payton Award will be presented to the top player in I-AA football during the 2006 season.

Colgate has two previous winners of the Walter Payton Award - Kenny

Gamble (1987) and Jamaal Branch (2003).

Scott is coming off a highly-decorated rookie season that saw him earn third team All-America honors, Patriot League Rookie of the Year, ECAC Rookie of the Year, and The Sports Network co-Rookie of the Year. He led the Patriot League in rushing with 320 carries for 1,364 yards and 10 touchdowns while leading Colgate to a share of the Patriot League title, and its seventh appearance in the I-AA playoffs.



FOUR COLGATE PLAYERS TABBED WITH PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Football Gazette tabbed four Colgate football players for preseason All-America honors.

Sophomore tailback **Jordan Scott** was named to the first team, while senior center **Jake Sulovski** and senior defensive back **Geoff Bean** were third team selections and senior quarterback **Mike Saraceno** received honorable mention recognition.

SCOTT, BEAN RECEIVE PRESEASON PATRIOT LEAGUE HONORS

Colgate sophomore tailback **Jordan Scott** was selected as the Patriot League preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while senior strong safety **Geoff Bean** was named the preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

BRANCH SIGNS WITH NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

Former Colgate All-America running back and 2003 Walter Payton winner **Jamaal Branch** has been signed to the New Orleans Saints' practice squad for the 2006 season.

Branch was with the Saints throughout training camp getting considerable playing time in the exhibition games. He was the 10th leading rusher in the NFL during preseason games with 171 yards on 39 carries (4.4 per carry) and two touchdowns.

Branch was one of four players re-signed to the practice squad after clearing waivers.

COLGATE TRI-CAPTAINS

Senior quarterback **Mike Saraceno**, senior strong safety **Geoff Bean** and senior center **Jake Sulovski** are Colgate's tri-captains for the 2006 season.

SCOTT BROKE COLGATE'S FRESHMAN RUSHING RECORD

Jordan Scott set a Colgate freshman rushing record with 1,364 yards while leading the Patriot League. He was the first Colgate freshman running back in school history to gain over 1,000 yards in a season.

Scott was the fifth Colgate running back in Patriot League history to win the rushing title. Kenny Gamble, the first ever Walter Payton Award winner, did it twice (1986 and 1987), Anthony Caravetta in 1996, Randall Joseph in 1999 and Jamaal Branch in 2003.

TOTAL DEFENSE

Last season, the Raiders finished 16th in the nation in total defense, allowing 308.83 yards per game. In 2004, Colgate was ninth in total defense, allowing 299.36 yards per game, and in 2003, 15th in total defense, allowing 302.1 yards per game.

AIR FORCE/COLGATE TO MEET ON THE GRIDIRON

Colgate athletics director Dave Roach has announced an agreement between Colgate and Air Force to meet on the gridiron.

Colgate will travel to Colorado Springs, Colorado on August 31 to open its 2013 season.

The Raiders have played five previous times west of the Mississippi River in their 116 years of intercollegiate football: Nebraska (1924); Iowa (1935 and 1938); Wyoming (1983), and St. Mary's, Calif. (1999).
